# **Appendix 3: Tree Species Native to the Brecon Beacons National Park**

The NPA is keen to ensure that the new planting uses species naturally occurring in the Park.

The plants used should be of local provenance<sup>40</sup> where possible, verified if necessary by the Forestry Commission or another reputable agency. If this is not possible, they should be of British stock.

Details of schemes should always be agreed with the National Park Authority prior to planting.
